Candidates for the degree of Bachelor of Science in the College of Mines and Earth Sciences must complete a course program of at least 122 semester hours of work approved by the dean and the faculty of the college, including the subject requirements prescribed in Section 4 of this chapter.

Students in the College of Mines and Earth Sciences must major in one of the following subjects: fuels engineering, geological engineering, geology, geophysics, metallurgy and metallurgical engineering, meteorology, and mining engineering.
