Introduction and Background:

Policy 6-304 was last edited substantively in May 1999. As part of a systematic review process recently implemented, this policy was flagged as requiring a review.

Proposed Changes:

As a result of the internal review, the following editorial changes are proposed:

- Define both a policy purpose and scope
- Remove numerical reference of faculty membership/academic colleges
- Update vice president for academic affairs to the Associate Vice President for Faculty and Associate Vice President for Health Sciences or designee(s) to match current practice
- Rename sections to match section purpose
- Clarifying edits and rewording
- Update name of Senate Faculty Review Standards Committee
- Remove specific references to policy sections to avoid policy conflicts

Policy 6-304: University Promotion and Tenure Advisory Committee. (UPTAC).

Revision 23. Effective date: September 17, 1999Pending

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I. Purpose and Scope

A. Purpose.

(Reserved) To define the membership and duties of the University Promotion and Tenure Advisory Committee.

B. Scope.

(Reserved)This policy applies to the formal review processes for all tenure-line faculty.

II. Definitions

III. Policy

- A. Membership
 - The University Promotion and Tenure Advisory Committee (UPTAC) shall consist of fifteenone tenured faculty membersmember from each of the academic colleges and four fully matriculated students, including at least one graduate student, with the vice president.
 - 1.2. The Associate Vice President for academic affairs Faculty and the Associate
 <u>Vice President for Health Sciences</u> or the vice president's
 <u>delegatedesignee(s) serve</u> as ex_officio <u>chairperson.co-chairs.</u>
- B. Election to the committee
- B. Committee membership and alternates
 - The faculty members of the University Promotion and Tenure Advisory Committee shall be elected by the tenure-line faculty of their respective <u>colleges</u> for three-year terms, with one member from each of the colleges.
 One-third of the faculty committee member terms shall expire each year.
 - 2. The student <u>membermembers</u> shall be selected for one-year terms according to <u>Proceduresprocedures</u> established by and under the supervision of the Associated Students of the University of Utah. (ASUU).
 - <u>3.</u> Committee members may be reelected and succeed themselves as representatives of their respective areas. To be elected, a
 - 4. Each academic college shall conduct an election at the end of the college committee member's term electing the next college committee member and

<u>an alternate. The selected</u> candidate for this committee must receive a majority of the votes cast in the candidate's college.

- 4.<u>5.</u> No individual who is an ex officio member of the Academic Senate shall be eligible for election to this committee.
- C. Appointment of alternates

C. Alternates

- The Personnel and Elections Committee of the Academic Senate shall appoint anrequest a college alternate to function in the place of any elected member of the committee who resigns or will be absent from the university for one or more semesters, or expects to be absent for such a period. If a duly elected member returns to the university, that member shall assume the committee position and serve out the balance of the term.
- D. Disqualification or Recusal
 - 1. No committee member shall be present during the consideration of any case from a department with which the committee member is associated as a faculty member or a student major, or for any case in which the committee member has been involved in the sequence of review.
 - 4.2. In addition, committee members shall decline to participate in the consideration of any case in which they have a personal bias or interest which would preclude their making a fair and objective decision.
- E. Duties
 - Case Review. The University Promotion and Tenure Advisory CommitteeUPTAC shall perform such duties as may be required under the provisions of Policy 6-303, <u>III-H & K</u>, and Policy 6-003, <u>III-Section 2-C321</u>.
 - Standards. The University Promotion and Tenure Advisory
 CommitteeUPTAC shall receive and review the annual report of the RPT
 <u>Senate Faculty Review</u> Standards and Review Committee relevant to

departmental standards, <u>and</u>, <u>based</u> on its experience with given departments' standards, <u>UPTAC</u> may recommend that the <u>committee Senate</u> Faculty Review Standards Committee review the standards of a department.

- F. Recommendations
 - The<u>UPTAC shall submit</u> recommendations of the University Promotion and Tenure Advisory Committee will be submitted to the cognizant <u>senior</u> vice president.
